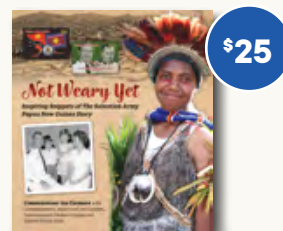

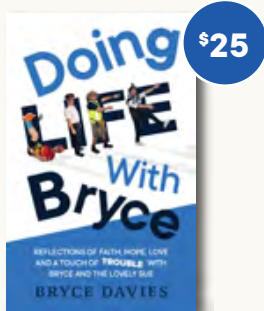
Still Serving - The Salvation Army in the Boer War and WW1
